Addressing Economically Disadvantaged Student Needs in the 21st Century

The Instructional Support Staff at CiTi will be launching a major initiative to inform and assist CNY school districts in creating a district plan in order to address the needs of their students living in economic stress. This full-day training at CiTi will provide participants with the necessary tools to move forward as a district team in order to address specific issues and policies that may be, unintentionally, impeding academic and social achievement for students living in poverty. Participants will leave the training with an overview of poverty and economic disadvantage data from the region; a review of the effects that poverty



can have on brain development and learning potential; a knowledge of practices and policies which may impede student achievement; a toolbox of strategies which could be applied to your district. As a highlight of the workshop, a poverty simulation activity is embedded in the training. Participants assume the role of a person living in poverty while trying to meet all financial obligations, insure that their children attend school regularly, maintain a steady state of employment, and provide the needed services in order to keep their family safe and healthy. This training is designed to for district teams comprised of stakeholders from all levels of school organization. The conversation and planning portion of the training will be enriched by the inclusion of voices from throughout the organization. Nonetheless, all are encouraged and welcome to participate, even if they are not a member of a district team.

We will begin our second year of Comprehensive Planning-Training & Support. If your district participated in year 1, we will continue to work with you on revising and reviewing your current plans, collapsing plans, monitoring plans, and designing program evaluation. If your district has not yet participated but would like to join us, we will take a look at the core of high quality planning, data driven decision making, matching strategic actions to identified needs, aligning all the plans with the core of the district, and designing on-going monitoring and program evaluation. All good planning begins with a team of stakeholders. Typically, you need representation from the following groups: district level, building level, instructional specialists, content/grade levels, paraprofessionals, and bargaining units. Many plans also require parent representation. We will schedule four sessions this year. Three will be evening sessions so that you can involve non-district staff stakeholders if you wish. This initiative will continue to evolve as new districts join with varied needs. As a team you must commit to all four sessions. There will be an \$800 charge per team to cover a light meal and materials.

Masonic Model Students Assistance Program Training

Whether you are just beginning a Student Assistance Team or would like a refresher for your already existing groups, the Masonic Model Student Assistance Program is an intensive 3 day workshop for teams of 5-8 members. During MMSAP training, a team of professional trainers works with educators to provide:

- Information on factors that contribute to crisis for children; at-risk behaviors that signal crisis; and the value of early intervention and prevention.
- Information on Developmental Assets and the importance of their role in a child's life
- Information and guidelines on how to set up and function as an in-school Student Assistance Team; how a team assesses behavior, academics, health and attendance -- signs that may indicate a problem, and what kind of actions to take.
- Handbooks, prepared forms and materials for the Student Assistance Teams to use in student assessment and assistance.

Student Assistance Program Training will:

- Assist students with physical, emotional, social, or substance abuse problems.
- Improve the quality of education in schools and the school environment.
- Use existing human resources rather than require new professional staff.
- Enlist the support and involvement of all professional staff members.
- Focus on education rather than on resolving major social problems. MMSAP is a research-based and
 effective response to the negative behaviors that interfere with the success of children and their school
 communities. It has also been successfully used by teams for data-based/data-driven decision making
 as part of Tier Two in Response to Intervention (RTI). Districts/Schools should send teams who will be
 working together.

For the 2014-2015 NYSAA administration, SED provided sample verifying evidence in the form of student work samples and data collection sheets in ELA, mathematics, science and social studies.
