Resolved by the Board of Cooperative Educational Services of the Sole Supervisory District of Oswego County, New York As follows:

Section 1. Revenue Anticipation Notes (herein called "Notes") of the Board of Cooperative Educational Services of the Sole Supervisory District of Oswego County, New York (herein called the "BOCES"), in the principal amount of not to exceed \$3,500,000, and any notes in renewal thereof, are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of Sections 25.00 and 39.00 of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law").

Section 2. The following additional matters are hereby determined and declared:

- (a) The Notes shall be issued in anticipation of the receipt of moneys expected to be received by BOCES from the component districts of the BOCES for services and administrative and clerical expenses during the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2016 (such moneys herein referred to as the "Revenue"), and the proceeds of the Notes shall be used only for the purposes of paying the expenses of the BOCES for said fiscal year payable from the Revenue in anticipation of which they are issued.
- (b) The Notes are not issued in renewal of any other notes.
- (c) The Notes shall mature within the period of one year from the date of their issuance.
- (d) No revenue anticipation notes have been heretofore issued in anticipation of said revenue.

Section 3. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and the Law, and pursuant to Section 50.00 and Sections 56.00 to 61.00 of the Law, inclusive, the power to sell and issue the Notes authorized pursuant hereto, or any renewals thereof, and to determine the terms, form and contents, including the manner of execution, of such Notes, and to execute arbitrage certifications relative thereto, is hereby delegated to the President of the Board, the chief fiscal officer of the BOCES.

Section 4. The Notes shall be executed in the name of the BOCES by the manual signature of the President of the Board, the Vice President of the Board, the District Treasurer, the District Clerk, or such other officer of the BOCES as shall be designated by the chief fiscal officer of the BOCES, and shall have the corporate seal of the BOCES impressed or imprinted thereon which corporate seal may be attested by the manual signature of the District Clerk.

Section 5. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

10.3 <u>Discussion Regarding RFP's for Attorney Services.</u>

Mr. Todd informed the Board that he had received a contract to renew services with CiTi's school attorney and asked if the Board would like to do a RFP for services prior to signing the contract. District Superintendent Todd explained that he is not unhappy with the services of the current firm, but just feels it is the fiscally responsible thing to do. The Board agreed to do an RFP for legal services.

10.4 EPC Rebates

Mr. Todd and Mr. Sheperd shared a handout with the Board of Education that showed the various rebates that had been received for energy performance. Mr. Sheperd and Mr. Todd asked the Board what they wished to do with the rebates. Various scenarios were presented to the Board including the one that was picked, which was to use the rebates to offset lease payments in the coming years. The bid is structured as an aggregate award to the lowest responsible bidder. In addition to providing HVAC filters, the bid included the request for filter consultation services performed by a Certified Air Filter Specialist. As a requirement for award consideration, vendors were required to provide documentation certifying they employ staff possessing the certificate of a National Air Filtration Association Certified Air Filter Specialist.

Bid proposals were opened for cooperative bid B16-0451 – HVAC Filters and Filter Consult Services, on March 16, 2016. In addition to advertising the bid in the Palladium Times and posting the bid opportunity on the CiTi website, solicitations were emailed directly to six (6) potential bidders. Analysis: Following a review of the bid proposals, service component and pricing, CiTi requested each bidder supply several comparable samples for a hands-on product review by the individual school districts participating in the bid. The bid reserved the right for the Superintendents of Buildings and Grounds to review the filters and provide the sole determination as to the quality of the proposed products (special conditions, #16). A review committee consisting of four (4) Superintendents of Buildings and Grounds (SPGs) and one licensed HVAC technician reviewed the submitted product samples with CiTi representatives. In regards to the MERV 81" filters, the committee noted that the frames were not of comparable standard. The Clark Air Systems filters were constructed using staples, were not as sturdy, and lacked a cross-section of construction support. A thickness gage measured the outside frame of the Clair Air Systems filter at 0.0360". The comparable Camfil filter measured at 0.0545". Following a push/pressure test of each filter's media, it was noted that the wires were not of comparable standard as the Camfil filter resisted greater pressure. In regards to the MERV 8 2" filters, the committee reviewed a cross-section of each sample provided and noted that the Camfil filters are constructed with a 'U" shaped pleat while the Clark Filters were constructed with a 'V' shaped pleat. The HVAC technician noted that in his professional experience the 'V' shaped pleats run the risk of clogging faster which impacts maintenance (need for a more aggressive maintenance schedule) and budget (the need to purchase more filters in a fiscal year). The actual material utilized in the media was also examined and it was noted that the media in the Camfil filter was thicker, which better resists the penetration of particulates. With the 1" and 2" filters representing the large majority of the bid participants' buy off of the bid, the review committee determined the filters proposed by Clark Air Systems did not meet the minimum quality standard set forth in the bid specifications and recommended an award to Camfil.

Recommendation: The HVAC Filters with Filter Consult Services (B16-0451) with a contract date from June 1, 2016 to May 31, 2017 be awarded to Camfil USA as indicated above.



On occasion and as needed, public agencies borrow funds in anticipation of the receipt of revenues throughout the fiscal year. The mechanism to do this is called a Revenue Anticipation Note or RAN. As part of this process, a public agency hires and relies on financial and legal services from a financial advisor and an attorney, referred to as bond counsel.

FINANCIAL ADVISOR: in order to proceed appropriately through the various activities required for borrowing funds, we use Fiscal Advisors & Marketing, Inc. of Syracuse, New York. Our Board designated them as our Financial Advisor during the July Reorganization Meeting, and our organization has worked regularly with their representatives on various issues.

BOND COUNSEL: the role of the bond counsel is to obtain a professional opinion with respect to the legality of a bond issue, to prepare the appropriate forms for execution, to review the procedures affecting the sale of the bonds, and to advise on meeting technicalities. For these purposes, our Board designated the firm of Hawkins, Delafield & Wood as Bond Counsel during the July Reorganization Meeting, and we work with attorney Martin A. Geiger, Esq.

For Board consideration at their May 11, 2016 meeting, please find attached the resolution prepared by our bond counsel authorizing the issuance of a Revenue Anticipation Note in an amount *not to exceed* \$3,500,000. We have also included other supporting documents that are required to be completed by the District Clerk.

Section 1. Section 2. The following additional matters are hereby determined and declared:

- (a) The Notes shall be issued in anticipation of the receipt of moneys expected to be received by BOCES from the component districts of the BOCES for services and administrative and clerical expenses during the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2016 (such moneys herein referred to as the "Revenue"), and the proceeds of the Notes shall be used only for the purposes of paying the expenses of the BOCES for said fiscal year payable from the Revenue in anticipation of which they are issued.
 - (b) The Notes are not issued in renewal of any other notes.
- (c) The Notes shall mature within the period of one year from the date of their issuance.
- (d) No revenue anticipation notes have been heretofore issued in anticipation of said revenue.

Section 3. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and the Law, and pursuant to Section 50.00 and Sections 56.00 to 61.00 of the Law, inclusive, the power to sell and issue the Notes authorized pursuant hereto, or any renewals thereof, and to determine the terms, form and contents, including the manner of execution, of such Notes, and to execute arbitrage certifications relative thereto, is hereby delegated to the President of the Board, the chief fiscal officer of the BOCES.

It is also worthy to note that as part of the write-off process, each of these people will receive a 1099 form as these amounts represent cancelled debt which must be claimed as personal income.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Oswego County Board of Cooperative Educational Services, upon the recommendation of the District Superintendent and the BOCES' external auditor, hereby authorizes that the total sum of \$40,843.53 owed to the BOCES for participation in various BOCES Adult and Continuing Education programs, as are specifically noted on the list of debtors with amounts owed and attached hereto as Exhibit "A", be written off the books of the BOCES inasmuch as all reasonable means to collect such debts have been exhausted, including submitting such claims to a collection agency and in some cases having had the debtor file for bankruptcy.

Since its creation in 1985 the NYS Conservation Competition has given an opportunity for Conservation students to visit educational institutions and have the opportunity to earn scholarships for future education. The contests were created because there wasn't an avenue with FFA or SkillsUSA (formerly VICA) that allowed the application of knowledge and skills learned in the conservation programs. The contests are exclusively designed for students enrolled on Conservation Programs and are geared to the specific skills and abilities gained from those programs. Some of the programs don't incorporate all aspects and those schools only enter students in competitions they have been trained for. These schools may have stand-alone equipment programs or other programs that teach similar skills but those programs have SkillsUSA contests or FFA CDE's geared specifically for them. The colleges that host these contests (Paul Smith's, SUNY Morrisville, SUNY Cobleskill and Finger Lakes Community College) provide scholarships to winning students.

The students entered are enrolled in the Conservation Program and qualify for the 2016 NYS Conservation Competitions.

NEW YORK STATE CONSERVATION CONTESTS

Code of Conduct

- 8) This is a tobacco free campus. Any <u>tobacco</u> product is NOT allowed. (This includes E-Cigarettes as well.)
- 9) Drugs and/or alcohol are NOT allowed.
- 10) Use of unauthorized electronic device is prohibited during the individual events.
- 11) Competitors must participate in an AM Trophy Contest to enter the PM Woodsmen's Contests.
- 12) A student cannot enter more than two (2) Trophy Contests and no more than there (3) Woodsmen's Events.
- 13) A Student can be in only one Equipment Contest (Bulldozer, Backhoe, Skidder, or Skidsteer) and must be present when the name is called. When a student has completed such contests, they may enter another event but it must be one of the contests that has an unlimited number status (UL).
- 14) A student can only participate in an event that they have received safety instruction and training for. If you have not been properly instructed by your TEC Instructor then you will not be allowed to participate in that event)

Violators of this code will be disqualified from any awards and not allowed further participation. Contestants found to be in possession of or using any tobacco products, illegal drugs, or alcohol will be removed from the contest, at which time their parents(s)/guardian(s) will be notified and responsible for transporting the contestant from the competition grounds.




