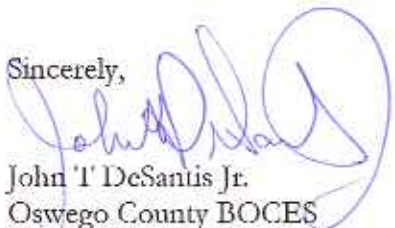


The associations, industry contacts and attention our students draw, will hopefully gain them an advantage when they continue on in their educational and professional careers.

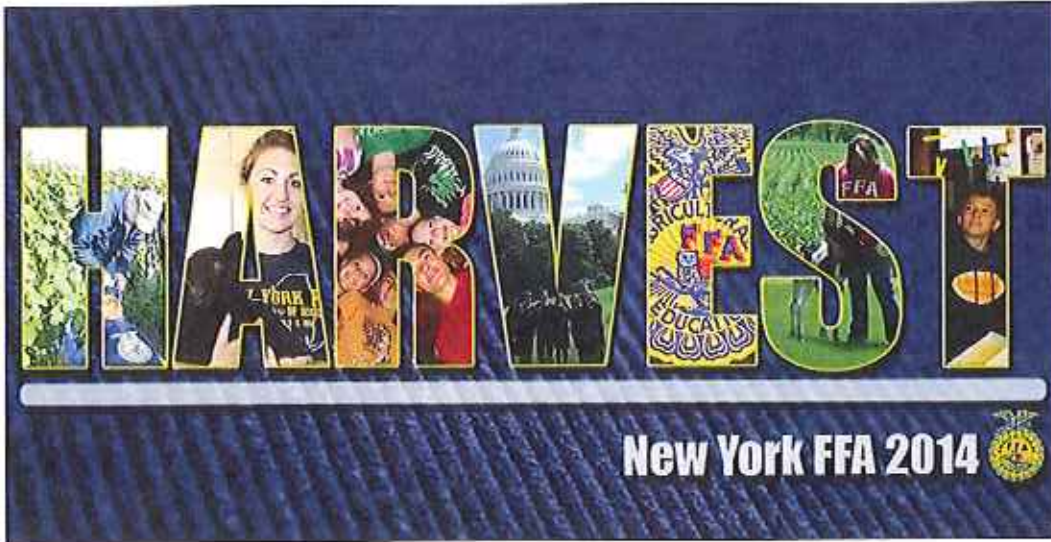

### **SUBJECT: REIMBURSEMENT FOR APPROVED EXPENSES**

BOCES employees, and members of the BOCES Board will be reimbursed for reasonable, actual and necessary out-of-pocket expenses which are legally authorized and incurred while traveling for BOCES-related activity when the following conditions are met:

- a) General Municipal Law Section 77-B mandates that authorization for attendance at conferences, workshops, seminars and training must be approved by the District Superintendent or Designee prior to the date of the event.
- b) Employees must submit written requests for approval to attend on a Professional Development Attendance Request Form furnished by the District Superintendent indicating prior approval of the administrator.
- c) ~~Board members and employees traveling on approved expense accounts are expected to submit a completed expense reimbursement claim form, together with appropriate itemized receipts for lodging, travel, meals et al, in order to be reimbursed for expenses.~~  
Expenses for overnight-approved travel will be reimbursed by completing an expense reimbursement claim form and attaching original receipts for lodging and other reimbursable expenses (parking, taxi, tolls, etc.).  
Meals and incidentals (e.g., tips, etc.), will be reimbursed at the U.S. General Services Administration (GSA) per diem rate, upon completion of an expense reimbursement claim form, for full days of conference attendance, and at 75% of the GSA rate for travel days. When meals are included in conference registration fees or hotel rates, a deduction must be made from the applicable per diem rate. Although no receipts for individual meals are necessary, an employee certification that the travel occurred must accompany the claim.
- d) No travel expense will be approved for payment should an expense reimbursement claim form be submitted for unauthorized travel or absence from work.
- e) The Oswego County Board of Cooperative Educational Services will reimburse BOCES employees when it is necessary for an employee to use the employee's personal vehicle for BOCES business. The reimbursement rate will be in accordance with the Internal Revenue Service prevailing (IRS) Mileage Rate.

## Students

**SUBJECT: NOTIFICATION OF SEX OFFENDERS**

In accordance with the Sex Offender Registration Act ("Megan's Law"), the Board of Cooperative Education Services supports the New York State Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) in its effort to inform the community in certain circumstances of the presence of individuals with a history of sex offenses, particularly against children, in the school locality. This policy is enacted in order to minimize the possibility that the sex offender will come in contact with school-age children, and to assist law enforcement agencies in preventing further criminal activity from occurring. Furthermore, the BOCES shall cooperate with local police authorities and the local community in promoting and protecting the safety and well being of its students.

It is the policy of the BOCES to disseminate all information which the BOCES receives from local police authorities in conjunction with Megan's Law to designated staff members who might have possible contact with the offender during the course of their school duties including, but not limited to, building principals, supervisors, teachers, office personnel, and custodians. The District Superintendent reserves the right to automatically disseminate such information to additional members of the staff, designated supervisors of non-school groups that regularly use BOCES facilities and have children in attendance, parents/guardians of BOCES students, and other community residents who, in the opinion of the District Superintendent, have an immediate need to be notified of such data in order to protect the safety of our students.

Information that is disseminated to the BOCES pursuant to Megan's Law may be disclosed or not disclosed by the BOCES in its discretion. In situations where BOCES personnel work in component school district classrooms or programs, the policy for that school district relating to notification of sex offenders will prevail.

1. Staff members shall inform their immediate supervisor if they observe within the school building, on school grounds, at school activities, or at or near bus routes any individual whose description matches the information which was provided to the BOCES by local law enforcement authorities. Such law enforcement officials will be notified of this information by the BOCES as appropriate.

Any information which the BOCES receives regarding a sex offender from a source other than the Sex Offender Registry, and which is maintained independent of the requirements of Megan's Law, will be available from the BOCES, upon written request, in accordance with the requirements of the Freedom of Information Law.

**Special Circumstances Whereby Sex Offenders May Enter Upon School Grounds**

As a mandatory condition of the sentence for sex offenders placed on probation or conditional discharge whose victim was under the age of eighteen (18) or who has been designated a Level 3 sex offender, the court requires that such sentenced offender refrain from knowingly entering into or upon school grounds or any other facility or institution primarily used for the care or treatment of persons under the age of eighteen (18) while one or more of such persons are present.

**SUBJECT: NOTIFICATION OF SEX OFFENDERS (Cont'd.)**

However, by exception, a sex offender may enter school grounds or facility with the written authorization of his/her parole officer and the District Superintendent for limited authorized purposes. Entrance upon the premises is subject to the following conditions:

- a) The offender is a registered student, ~~participant or employee of the facility;~~
- ~~— b) —~~ The offender is an employee of an entity contracted by the facility;
- ~~— c) —~~ The offender has a family member enrolled in the facility; or
- ~~— d) —~~ If the school is the offender's designated polling place and he/she enters solely to vote.

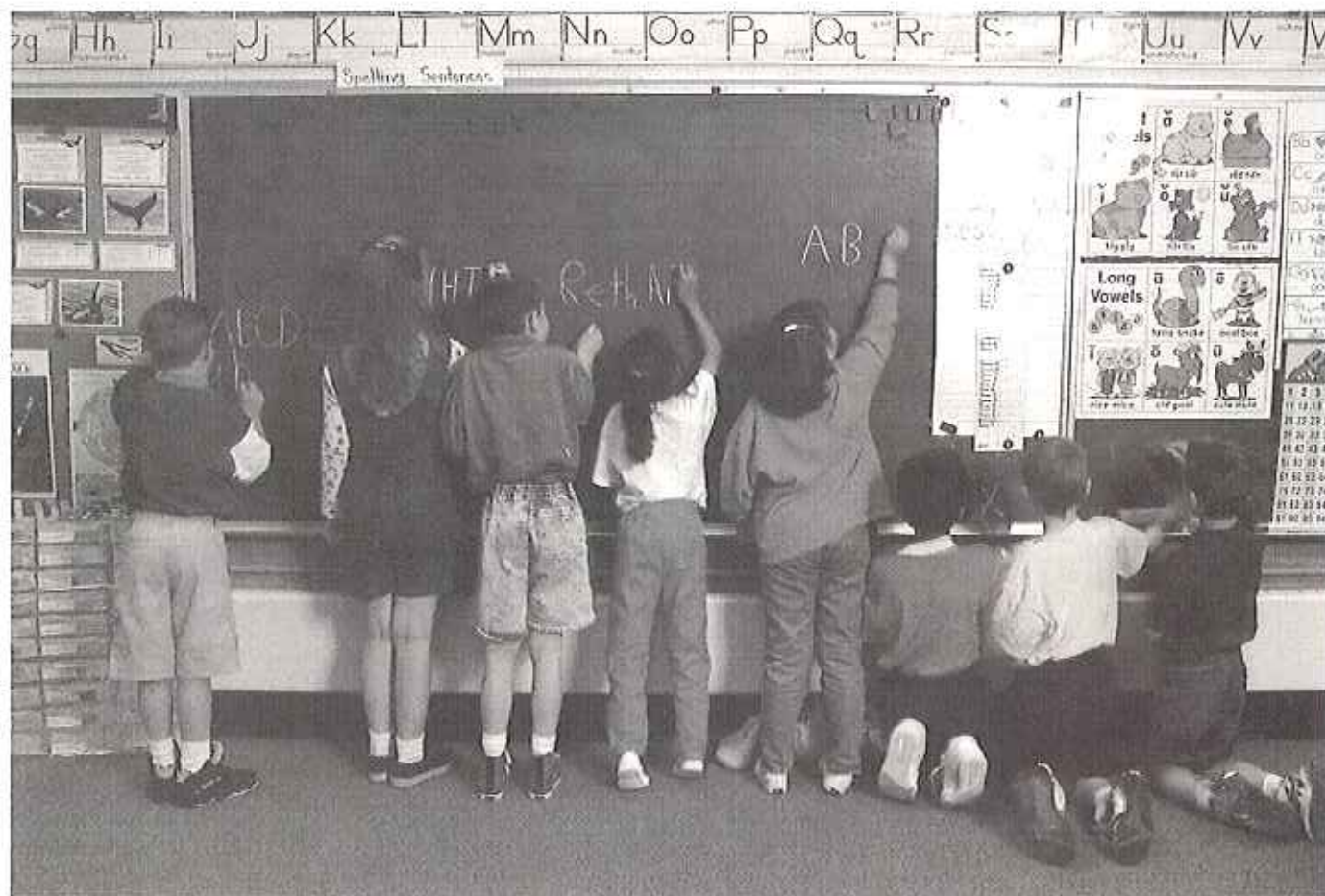
**Implementation**
