

Arrival at OCC:

Organize your upcoming assignments into your planner, a to-do list or a virtual calendar; set phone reminders



What if I am really stressed about a course?

Email Ms. Warren, Mr. Gardner and Mr. Lupa to set up a counseling appointment and get some strategies

What if I feel disorganized?

Email Ms. Warren, Mr. Gardner and Mr. Lupa: we will help you get organizational coaching

What if I miss a few homeworks and fall behind?

Email Ms. Warren, Mr. Gardner and Mr. Lupa: we will help you get tutoring or structures

What We Monitor

P-TECH staff track three key areas that affect success in college:

- Attendance showing up consistently for college classes, P-TECH interventions, and required supports.
- Motivation/Mental Health –
 effort shown through assignment
 completion, timeliness, and
 persistence; feelings of well-being
- Behavior professionalism, safety, and conduct that reflects readiness for college and career.

Supports and Interventions Available

If concerns arise, we don't just monitor—we provide supports. These may include:

- Student Meetings to problem-solve challenges directly with staff.
- Parent Communication ongoing updates and meetings to keep families involved.
- Tutoring & Extra Help all juniors have the opportunity for tutoring for Math and Electrical courses on Mondays and Wednesdays; all PTECH seniors 5th and 6th years are invited to come back on Fridays for tutoring with P-TECH staff, structured check-ins (Check + Connect with Mr. Gardner), or tutoring at OCC's Learning Center.
- Organization & Time Management Supports structured schedules, checklists, and staff-led coaching to help students manage coursework.
- Mental Health Supports access to OCC Counseling Services or check-ins with Mr. Lupa for emotional and mental health needs.
- Learning Contracts formalized agreements outlining expectations/strategies for growth
- District Support Meetings including principals, counselors, and P-TECH leadership

College Academic Success Policy



Oswego County P-TECH - College Academic Success Policy

Why This Policy Matters

Oswego County P-TECH covers the cost of tuition, fees, and textbooks for Onondaga Community College (OCC) coursework required to earn an AAS degree in the approved pathways. In exchange, students are expected to attend regularly, stay engaged, and complete their coursework responsibly.

This policy ensures accountability for college opportunities while protecting resources so that all students in the P-TECH program can access the same support and chance to succeed.

Policy Statement

1. Attendance Requirements

- Excessive Absences: If a student misses four (4) or more class sessions in any OCC course, they
 may be allowed to complete the semester. However, if they need to re-enroll in the course to
 earn credit, the student and/or their parent/guardian will be financially responsible for the
 repeat attempt (tuition, fees, and textbooks).
- Academic Withdrawal by OCC: If a student is administratively withdrawn by OCC due to attendance or participation issues, the student and/or their parent/guardian will be financially responsible for the next enrollment of that course.

2. Voluntary Course Withdrawal

 If a student voluntarily withdraws from a course (after OCC's official add/drop period has ended), they will be financially responsible for the cost of re-enrolling in that course to meet degree requirements.

3. Repeated Course Failures or Withdrawals


- Same Course: If a student fails the same course twice, the student and/or their parent/guardian will be financially responsible for the third attempt and any subsequent attempts.
- Multiple Courses: If a student accumulates three (3) or more separate course failures or
 withdrawals (in different courses), the student and/or their parent/guardian will be financially
 responsible for the next OCC course in which they enroll and any additional repeats thereafter.







Office of Accessibility Resources (OAR)

Students who have an IEP or 504 plan can qualify for accommodations through the Office of Accessibility Resources (OAR).

Digital copies of a student's IEP or 504 plan will be emailed to the Office of Accessibility Resources (OAR) by Oswego County P-TECH.

Transportation

Students who are being picked up early from OCC and not using bus transportation are **REQUIRED** to notify their **HOME DISTRICT TRANSPORTATION** office **AND MR. GARDNER**.

Transportation

Students in (11th Grade) and (12th Grade) are to use district or parent transportation to OCC for the 2025/2026 school year.

Students ARE NOT permitted to drive to campus using their own vehicles.

<u>Students ARE NOT</u> permitted to drive to school using a vehicle from another student.

Student ARE NOT permitted to walk off campus or ride with anyone else off OCC campus for lunch or any other reason.

School Delay / Cancellation

Students follow their home district transportation decisions for all weather related travel.

Scenario: Students will not attend OCC if their home district is closed.

Scenario: Students will travel to OCC if their home district is delayed.

Questions related to transportation should be directed to their home district's transportation office.

Students **MUST** communicate with their professor if they are not present in class.

Attendance

- Students must check in with Mr. Gardner each day upon arrival.
 Meeting will be on first floor by the elevator.
- This includes drop off by school bus and parent.
- Students home district and P-TECH are notified daily on student attendance.

Student Meals

- Students have the option of bringing their own lunch, receiving a school lunch (provided by the school district) or purchase lunch from the college cafeteria.
- Free breakfast and lunch is provided through Mexico CSD Food Services.
- Average cost of a lunch from OCC cafeteria is \$10.00
 - Commuter Meal Plan Mrs. Warren
- Students are required to order lunches by seeing Mrs. Warren in Whitney 314.
- Orders are due by the week before they are needed!
- Lunches can be picked up in P-TECH (W317) in Whitney Hall. Fridge/Microwave located in the room. Students should be taking their OWN lunch.

****Bagged lunches will not be available to students on days in which Mexico CSD is closed. P-TECH will provide another option for students to eat on those days.
